Student Support

The Office of International Affairs & Studies provides support to students throughout their time at Heidelberg. The office assists with immigration, housing, and academic concerns so students can succeed. They provide services such as airport transportation, visa regulation counseling, and assistance with applying for a US driver's license for international students.

Heidelberg English Language Institute (HELI)

For all new international students, HELI offers English language training combined with cultural orientation for students whose native language is not English. The program is also set up to provide educational opportunities such as field trips, conversation partner programs, a world student union, and host families.

International Cultural Center

Tiffin's International Cultural Center was the 2016 recipient of the Hugh M. Jenkins Award for Excellence in Community Programming given by NAFSA, an association for international educators. Its mission is to celebrate and demonstrate the relationships and interdependence among peoples and nations, to foster understanding and appreciation of different cultures, and to equip people young and old to assume leadership roles in our global society.

All courses within the International Baccalaureate program will be evaluated for the potential to earn college credit. Students who have earned the IB Diploma will be granted sophomore standing. Assessments are made based on Standard Level and Higher Level coursework and scores earned at these levels. Each student will be individually assessed when an equivalency does not exist. Reported equivalencies must have a score of 4 or higher.
