Honors and Scholars

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Honors and Scholars programs support high-achieving students committed to an exceptional learning experience. Approximately 500 students participate in Honors and Scholars Programs including the Tri-C Honors Program. All opportunities include substantial scholarship or stipend support, individual mentoring and other services. Eligibility requirements vary.

Phi Theta Kappa, the official honor society of community colleges, has four local chapters at Tri-C.



Student Life and Athletics

Diverse programs and services enhance students' overall social, cultural and educational growth by promoting learning and development outside of the classroom.

Opportunities include leadership training and certifications, student clubs and organizations, NJCAA athletics and special events and activities on each campus.

Transfer Support

Transfer Centers are located at each of Tri-C's four campuses to help students navigate the process from degree completion at Tri-C to successful transfer to a four-year institution.

- Application assistance
- Connection with four-year schools
- Transition planning

The Office of Articulation, Transfer and Prior Learning establishes student-centered articulation agreements and enhanced partnerships with four-year schools to optimize credit acceptance and create seamless transfer pathways that help students complete their educational goals.
